1st reading Book of Revelation Chapter 7, verses: 2-4 and 9-14; Psalm 24; 2nd reading 1st letter of John, Chapter 3, verses 1-3; Gospel of Saint Matthew, Chapter 5, verse 1-12A.

Bible Readings for All Souls Day Year A 1st reading from the Book of Wisdom chapter 3: verses 1-9

The souls of the just are in the hand of God, and no torment shall touch them. They seemed, in the view of the foolish, to be dead; and their passing away was thought an affliction and their going forth from us, utter destruction. But they are in peace. For if before men, indeed, they be punished, yet is their hope full of immortality; chastised a little, they shall be greatly blessed, because God tried them and found them worthy of himself. As gold in the furnace, he proved them, and as sacrificial offerings he took them to himself. In the time of their visitation they shall shine, and shall dart about as sparks through stubble; they shall judge nations and rule over peoples, and the LORD shall be their King forever. Not only that, but we also boast of God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.
