FAITH SHARING



Pentecost literally means 50th. It is a feast celebrated on the 50th day after the Passover feast by the Jews and a feast celebrated on the 50th day after the feast of the Resurrection of Jesus by the Christians. The Jewish Pentecost was originally a post-harvest thanksgiving feast. Later, the Jews included in it the remembrance of God's Covenants with Noah after the Deluge and with Moses at Mt. Sinai.

On the day of Pentecost The Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles and the Blessed Virgin Mary as fiery tongues. The frightened apostles were transformed into

fiery preachers and evangelizers and were given the gift of tongues by a special anointing of the Holy Spirit. The listeners experienced a fresh anointing of the Holy Spirit through the apostles' gift of tongues: they heard Peter speaking in their native languages. The early Christians became powerful witnesses and brave martyrs for their Faith in Jesus.

We need to permit the Holy Spirit to take control of our lives: by constantly remembering His holy presence and behaving well; by praying for His daily anointing so that we may fight against our temptations and control our evil tendencies, evil habits and addictions; by asking His daily assistance to pray,

listening to God through meditative Bible reading and talking to Him; and by asking the help of the Holy Spirit to do good for others and to be reconciled with God and others every day.

THE JEWISH CONCEPT OF SPIRIT

In Hebrew, the word for spirit is **ruah** ($^{\Pi\Pi\Pi}$), in Greek, **pneuma** ($^{\Pi\Psi\Psi}$); in Latin, **spiritus** – all of which suggest **breathing**. The idea is that when a person is breathing, he is alive.



It is from this notion that the idea of an animating, life-giving, intelligent and active force comes. The word (in Hebrew, Greek, and Latin), thus meant "breath", "life" and "spirit." The Jewish tradition taught that when the Messiah came, God's very own Life (Breath, Spirit) would be poured out upon all the faithful believers.
