FAITH SHARING

Today's Scripture readings challenge us to discern God's call to each one of us to become His disciple with a mission. We are asked to recognize God's holy presence and acknowledge our unworthiness due to our sinfulness to become humble instruments in His hands as the prophet Isaiah did in the first reading, as St. Paul did in the second reading and as St. Peter did in today's gospel. Today's readings also teach us that God has His own criteria for selecting people to be His disciples, ministers and prophets. Presenting the special calls, or vocations, of Isaiah, Paul and Peter as life-changing events, the readings challenge us to examine our own personal calls and the expected responses by true conversion in life and commitment in our discipleship.

ST. VALENTINE'S PATRON SAINT FEAST DAY

Today, on **Sunday, February 10, 2019** Parish Committee is inviting us after Mass to attend St. Valentine's Day brunch in church hall. This day is very special for us. On February 14, 1910 our Parish has been organized.

ST. VALENTINE'S PAINTING IN OUR CHURCH



Each Sunday during Mass we can see in our church the picture of St. Valentine located in the main altar. Do we know its story? Who is the artist who painted this icon for us? His name is Joseph A. Janczuk.

His family have been members of our church since 1928, long before his birth in 1947. Awarded a scholarship from the City of Philadelphia, he was educated at Temple University's Tyler School of Art. Since graduating, he has pursued a dual career as artist and as teacher of art. His works have been exhibited locally and nationally, and he has been the recipient of numerous awards.

The story of St. Valentine's martyrdom begins with the Emperor Claudius issuing a decree forbidding people to marry. Marriage kept men at home, and Claudius wanted them as soldiers to fight for Rome. Valentine ignored this decree and invited young lovers to come to him in secret to be united with the blessing of the Church. The secret

marriages were discovered, and the Emperor commended Valentine to be thrown into prison and later executed. One story says that, while in prison, he attempted to restore the sight of the blind daughter of the prison keeper, Asterius, whom he had befriended. Asterius promised to become Christian if Valentine performed this miracle.

Our painting shows St. Valentine performing the miracle of the restoration of the sight of Asterius's daughter.

The symbolism inherent in some of the elements of the painting is: the large gold medallion with the letters HIS symbolize Christ; the light of Christ is being cast onto the blind child in a beam of light; the little girl's left hand holds a cloth symbolizing the removal of her blindness. The figure behind the child is of that of the prison-keeper, her father, Asterius. The figure of St. Valentine is giving the blessing through the position of his left hand, while his right hand holds a palm frond symbolizing his martyrdom. The nimbus, or halo, above St. Valentine indicates his sainthood. The background reinforces the intensity of the light of Christ.

But not ...here, not on Margaret St. These buildings are very challenging to our budget. We just simply cannot invest more money here. Right after one broken thing is fixed, another two are broken.

There is a chance for us to build a brand new church campus in Bensalem. Therefore we must sell partially the land we owe over there. This decision we have to make together, all Parishioners.

CEMETERY IMPORTANT REMINDER

Please remove all Christmas ornaments/decorations from cemetery by February 17, 2019. Thank you.

And we ask you again – no artificial flowers or decorative items which have metal wires inside, even very thin. Metal wires destroy our lawn mower blades. Only metal Veterans emblems with flag holder and emblems of faith and societies are allowed. All such items must be placed with the confines of the flowerbed and

meet safety standards. Flowerbeds, veterans and memorial emblems/flags and other approved items are not allowed at the foot of the grave; only at the head of the grave. During the non-growing season (i.e. from November 15th to March 31st), artificial flowers and wreaths are permitted, only at the head of the grave, not more than 8 inches from headstone. These items must be removed each year before April 1st.



CEMETERY FENCE DAMAGED AGAIN BY DRUNK DRIVER

Last Sunday night a drunk driver hit our cemetery fence, drove over it and came to rest on our property. This time Bensalem Police caught the driver. Previously all other damages we had to cover from our own pocket. To make a claim and to use our property insurance we suppose to pay \$5K deductible. This time hopefully the fixing will be covered by driver's insurance. The estimated cost of repairing the fence is little over \$2,500.00 this time.


We have already three Police reports, so we can deal one more time with PennDOT and request the road side guard rail installation. Last time when our Parish applied for it PennDOT responded negative saying that there are not too many accidents over there to install the guard rail.

BROKEN HEATING IN OUR CHURCH - UPDATE

The broken heating system in our church and church hall is finally working. So far we replaced all sensors and main module. The dangerous gas leak has also been fixed. The efficiency of this system however is questionable. The gas bill for the period during fixing and testing is over \$1,000.

We have already an estimate for the total replacement of the old boiler. This might cost us \$32,500.00 (parts and labor). The parts we have already replaced can stay and be the parts for the new system.

We need your help. Sunday offerings are not enough to cover our bills. Only few families and individuals pay parish dues. There are many parishioners who did not support St. Valentine's for decades. Shame to say, but recently we got more support from our friends and sympathizers than from the registered parishioners. So far we collected **\$18,900.00** from donations made for this purpose only. From this amount we have to cover the cost of the replaced sensors and the other parts. If you can make some donations, please be as generous as possible. Every dollar makes a difference. Your donations will be highly appreciated. May God bless you and reward you!
