#### **FAITH SHARING**

The precious gift given to us by Jesus is the Holy Eucharist as our spiritual food. Corpus Christi is the celebration of the abiding presence of a loving God in order to give thanks to our Lord for his living with us in the Eucharist. The feast also gives us an occasion to learn more about the importance and value of the "Real Presence" so that we may appreciate it and better and receive maximum benefit from the Sacrament.

Today's first reading describes how the priest-king Melchizedek offered a thanksgiving-sacrifice of bread and wine to God for the welfare of the patriarch Abraham and shows how the event prefigured the Eucharistic sacrifice of the Priest-King Jesus. It is also as a sign of thanksgiving for Jesus' victory won over sin and death.

St. Paul gives the earliest account of what Jesus said and did during the last meal he celebrated with his followers, interpreting it as a sacrifice.

Today's Gospel describes Jesus' miraculous feeding of five thousand people by multiplying five loaves of bread and two fish. This feeding is a prefiguring of Jesus' gift of the Eucharistic bread that would spiritually nourish those who believe in him.
