FAITH SHARING

The central themes of today's readings are the importance of hospitality in Christian life and the necessity of listening to God before acting. The key to the Christian life is setting priorities: Jesus Christ first, then everything else. The only way really to learn that lesson is to spend some time every day, "sitting at the feet of Jesus."

Today's first reading describes how Abraham and Sarah's hospitality to angels in the guise of strangers was rewarded by God, who blessed them with a son in their old age.



In the second reading, Paul declares that he was commissioned by God to minister to the Church, as the revealer of the *mystery* of salvation and the preacher of the word in its *fullness*. He invites believers to open their hearts and minds and to show their hospitality to the mystery of Christ which he preaches. Paul also challenges us to cultivate that quality of hospitality which welcomes all others in Christ.

The Gospel passage describes how Martha, a true child of Abraham, wanted to extend the traditional generous hospitality of her people to Jesus, the true Messiah, by preparing an

elaborate meal for him, while her sister Mary spent her time in talking to Jesus and listening to him. Presenting Martha as a dynamo of action and Mary as a true listener to the word of God, today's Gospel invites us to serve others with Martha's diligence after recharging our spiritual batteries every day by prayer – listening to God and talking to God – as Mary did. We can minister truly to the needs of others only after welcoming God's Word into our hearts and minds.

CHURCH HALL BASEMENT RUINED

As you know, our church hall basement is flooded each time after rain. The kitchen, the bar area and both restrooms are completely ruined by water and mold. Basic insurance which we have, does not cover such damage.

Roof water from the next door abandoned house on Melrose St. due to clogged gutters and clogged underground pipe seriously damaged the concrete between our church hall and next door building. Because of it the water soaks deep to the ground and flows through our foundation. Moreover, it goes even farther, underground to the rectory basement and to the church.

All trials to contact the owner of the next door property failed. Even the Police can't help.

Last week two of our neighbors responded to my call in our bulletin and worked voluntarily in our basement removing the molded walls. Thank you very much for your good heart and heavy duty work.

There is a serious job that has to be done ASAP. If not, our church hall will be permanently closed due to toxic black mold inside.

FIRE EXTINGUISHERS INSPECTION


