FAITH SHARING

Today's readings are centered on Baptism and new life. Living water represents God's Spirit who comes to us in Baptism, penetrating every aspect of our lives and quenching our spiritual thirst.

The first reading describes how God provided water to the ungrateful complainers of Israel, thus placing Jesus' promise within the context of the Exodus account of water coming from the rock at Horeb.

In the second reading, Saint Paul asserts that, as the Savior of mankind, Jesus poured the *living water* of the gift of the Holy Spirit into our hearts.

In the Gospel, an unclean and outcast Samaritan woman is given an opportunity to receive the living water. Jesus awakened in the woman at the well a thirst for the wholeness and integrity which she had lost, a thirst which he had come to satisfy. This Gospel passage also gives us Jesus' revelation about himself as the Source of *Living Water* and teaches us that we need the grace of Jesus Christ for eternal life because he is that *life-giving water*.

A PRAYER IN OUR TIME OF THE CORONAVIRUS

O Jesus Christ, my Savior and healer, you traveled through towns and villages "curing every disease and illness." At your command, the sick were made well. Come to our aid now, in the midst of the global spread of the coronavirus, that we may experience your healing love.

our fear, which prevents nations from working together and neighbors from helping one another.

Lenten Lamentations this year will be only twice during Lent, after Mass on the second and four Sunday of Lent, that is March 8 and March 22.

This Catholic devotion containing many hymns that developed out of Poland in the 18th century is primarily a sung reflection and meditation on the Passion of Christ and the sorrows of His Blessed Mother.

There are many ways to celebrate Lent, one of them is the way of the Cross. Each Friday of Lent we have Stations of the Cross at 7:00 PM in our Church.

HEALTH PRECAUTIONS AT CHURCH

- The church will be open for Sunday Mass as long as the government authorities will limit public gatherings.
- Please don't sit together in groups in the pews, rather please keep yourself separated from each other.



- Please keep distance from other parishioners when you receive the Holy Communion.
- No handshaking, kissing and hugging as a peace sign during Mass. Instead, a wave, a peace sign 'V', a smile can be substituted.
- Greeting the clergy with a handshake at the doors after Mass will no longer take place.
- Coughing and sneezing into your elbow and arm instead of uncovered into the air around you will be appreciated by everyone and reduce the risk of infection.
- Parishioners who are exhibiting flu-like symptoms should remain at home from Mass until they are fully recovered from their illness.
- The clergy will continue to wash their hands before Mass as they always do. Additionally, they will use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer before and after distributing communion.
- We will observe these precautions as long as necessary.
