FAITH SHARING

Our Scripture lessons for today have one common, encouraging theme: No matter what happens in our lives, the risen Jesus is always with us. God is always near to those who seek Him and who want to live in His presence, doing His will.

The first reading, from Acts, is taken from the beginning of Peter's first public proclamation about Jesus and tells us how God raised Jesus from death, thus fulfilling the Messianic prophecies about the promised descendant of David.

In the second reading, Peter exhorts the early Christians to place their Faith and Hope in God Who has saved them through the precious Blood of His Son and Who has raised Jesus from the dead.

The Emmaus incident described in today's Gospel shows us a God who will not abandon us when we are hurt and disappointed. The message of today's Scripture readings is that the followers of Jesus are to maintain contact with their Risen Lord through prayer, the Eucharist, and the Bible. The readings also remind us

that our belief in Jesus' presence in the consecrated Bread and Wine should help us to understand better his presence in the Bible and in the believing and worshipping community.



CAN YOU SUPPORT OUR STREAMING AND HELP US TO BUY AN EQUIPMENT NEEDED?

If yes, please let me know. We are in need of two cameras (\sim \$500 - \$800 each), two field monitors (\sim \$120 each), Softbox Video Lighting Kit (\sim \$70) and extra cables (\sim \$80).

So far, all we have now is just a primitive equipment. My wife is very talented in combining it together and making it working, but it is time and efforts consuming and pretty complicated. And always requires at least two people to operate and monitor the broadcast.

To compare the cost, nearby parishes paid for professional installation and service of the video equipment \$3,500.00 plus.

UPDATE:

We received a donation of \$500.00 to cover the cost of this equipment from Mr. Kevin Grossman from St. Stephen Parish in Reading, PA, who was participating in our online Masses recently. Thank you very much, Kevin, it's a generous gift. Also one family from St. Valentine's anonymously donated \$70.00 for the lights. Thank you very much. May God bless our benefactors! Thanks to you we will be able to improve the streaming. The problem is, however, in the availability of the items we need to order. The closest date when they will be in stock is the end of May or June. Everyone is streaming now and working online: schools, churches, offices, even funeral homes. No items in stock right now.

I talked with few audio-video specialists and all of them are not recommending the cameras I wanted to purchase. And they are right. If we want to use streaming even after the world comes back to normal, we must invest our money wisely. The poor parish cannot afford purchasing a cheap equipment. It will be better to wait longer and collect more money and buy some brand named cameras which are certified, come with warranty and support.

Meantime, Izabela and I, learn every day and we practice, practice, practice. We are working on the simultaneously streaming on YouTube for those who have a problem with Zoom.

Moreover, for those parishioners who have no internet connection at all, neither the smartphone or laptop, but have a regular phone, there will be possible to join us by phone. Simply, just dial the number, dial meeting ID number and then password. This way they will be able to listen to our Masses.

TWO MASSES ON SUNDAY AT ST. VALENTINE'S

Beginning Sunday, April 19, there are two Masses at St. Valentine's. One at 9:30 AM streamed online as usually, the second at 12:00 Noon, without streaming. Simply the Mass which was offered in Our Saviour Parish in Lawrenceville, NJ will be now at St. Valentine's, but offered for the parishioners of Our Saviour. Every pastor assigned to parish is obliged to offer the Mass on Sunday for his parishioners. It won't be fair to combine these two Masses into one, therefore there will be two Masses, one for St. Valentine's members and one for Our Saviour. We have to do it due to traveling limitations as well as due to lack of WiFi connection in the other church building. Until Easter our cellphones were used as hotspots for streaming but cellular plan has monthly limits of using it. You understand what I am talking about.

Parishioners of Our Saviour share the cost of Zoom subscription with St. Valentine's. Please welcome them warmly into our community and let's join our prayers together asking God for his mercy.
