FAITH SHARING

The mystery of the most Holy Trinity is a basic doctrine of Faith in Christianity, understandable not with our heads but with our hearts. It teaches us that there are three distinct Persons in one God, sharing the same Divine Nature, co-equal and co-eternal.

Today's first reading, taken from the book of Exodus, describes how God revealed His name to Moses as "Yahweh," which means, "*I am Who am.*" But Orthodox Jews never used that name. They addressed God by calling Him Lord (*Adonai*).

The second reading contains the ancient apostolic blessing in the name of the Holy Trinity: "*The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you.*" Paul reminds the people of the Father's love, the grace that comes through Jesus Christ and the fellowship or the unifying power of the Holy Spirit. The word "*grace*" in a theological context refers to Divine favor. In Christ, God has shown favor toward us humans, a special care for us, and a desire that through Jesus' life, death and Resurrection we might find and enjoy a right relationship with God.

Today's Gospel comes from the story of Jesus' encounter with Nicodemus. Jesus speaks about the Father who has sent him (the Son), and after the Last Supper, He speaks about the Holy Spirit Whom he will send. He says that the Father has given him (the Son) all that He has and that Jesus, in turn, has given to the Holy Spirit all that he has received from the Father. In this we see the unity of purpose among the Three Persons of the Trinity.
