In the first reading, the prophet Jeremiah waits and hopes for an ideal descendant of King David Who, as Messiah of God, will bring security, peace, and justice to God's people.

In the second reading, Paul urges the Thessalonians to continue and intensify the life of holiness and mutual love he has taught them as they wait for "*the coming of our Lord Jesus with all His holy ones.*"

In today's Gospel, Jesus prophesies the signs and portents that will accompany his Second Coming and encourages us to be expectant, optimistic, vigilant, and well-prepared. Jesus wants us to face the future with confidence in God's providence.

This means that when the outside temperature will be in freezing range the heater will be running to prevent

the pipes damage. Please note that a few hundred feet of heat pipes are located under the church in the crawl space heating nothing, but this is the way the engineers designed the heating systems years ago when gas price was cheaper than dirt. Please help us to keep the church running.
