ACT OF SPIRITUAL COMMUNION

Most loving Jesus, I adore You in the Most Blessed Sacrament, in Which You are truly present. I love You above all things and I long for You in my soul. Since I cannot receive You sacramentally, I ask You to come spiritually into my heart and heal my soul. I embrace You and unite myself with You; may I never be separated from You. Inflame my heart with the fire of Your love, my Lord and Savior.

FAITH SHARING

This Thirty-Fourth and final Sunday in Ordinary Time ends the Church's liturgical year and the Cycle B Sundays. For this culminating Feast of Christ the King, the readings describe the enthronement of the victorious Christ as King in Heaven in all His glory.

The first reading, taken from the book of Daniel, tells of the mysterious Son of Man (with whom Jesus would later identify Himself), coming on the clouds, glorified by God, and given dominion that will last forever.

The Refrain for today's Responsorial Psalm (Ps 93), has us proclaim, "The Lord is King; He is robed in majesty," celebrating the God of Israel as the King over all creation.

In the second reading, taken from the Book of Revelation, the risen Christ comes amid the clouds as the Alpha and the Omega, the first and the last of all things.

In today's Gospel, Jesus asserts before Pilate that He is a king and clarifies that that his kingdom "does not belong to this world." He rules as King by serving others rather than by dominating them; His authority is rooted in Truth, not in physical force, and His



Kingdom, the reign of God, is based on the Beatitudes.
