FAITH SHARING

Who came first to the birthplace of the King? The humblest, lowliest, and most unworthy in man's eyes of all the inhabitants living around Bethlehem — the shepherds.

Way shall be made for Christ's salvation; all difficulties shall be removed – our first reading teaches us today. Christ brings a reward of comfort and peace with him; but a work of humiliation and reformation before him; and they shall be called, the holy people, and, the redeemed of the Lord.

In the second reading Paul, as a gentle father, felt the need to remind his children in the faith of these basic ways that they needed to behave in relation to this godless world.

In the Gospel reading the shepherds obey the angel's command with haste. More sophisticated people might hesitate. They would know questions to ask and problems to consider. What might they be getting themselves into? What might be the ramifications of their involvement? What precedents will they establish? Simpler folk find it easier to obey - are used to obeying orders - don't feel such a need to be in control - don't have a public image to protect. Simpler folk make better servants, and the Lord needs servants - people who obey.
