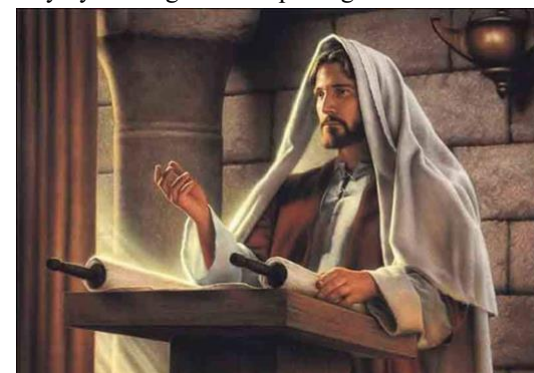
FAITH SHARING

The Scripture readings for today focus our attention on the importance and liberating power of the Word of God as “sacramental,” making God present in our midst. The readings challenge us to listen to the Word, accept it into our hearts, then put it into practice as we live out our lives, thus liberating ourselves and others from all types of bondages.

Today’s first reading, taken from Nehemiah, describe a public reading of Sacred Scripture which challenges the hearers to make a “fresh beginning” with a new outlook. After rebuilding the Temple and restoring the city, Ezra leads the people in a “*Covenant renewal*” ceremony by reading and interpreting the Law.

The Second Reading, taken from Paul’s first letter to the Corinthians, reminds us that “*together we are Christ’s Body, but each of us is a different part of it.*” This suggests that each of us has a share, as instruments in God’s hands, in bringing the freeing and saving mission of Christ to our world in our times.

Today’s Gospel describes how, on a Sabbath, Jesus stood before the people in the synagogue of his hometown, Nazareth, reading and interpreting what Isaiah had prophesied about the Messiah and his mission. To the great amazement and disbelief of his own townsmen, Jesus declares that Isaiah’s prophecy is being fulfilled at that very moment.
