PRAYING FOR THE DEAD: We gather at the cemetery to pray and remember our beloved departed loved ones. Many cultures have ways of honoring the dead. In Latin cultures they bring things to the grave such as food to spend time with their loved ones. In Asian cultures they honor the dead with incense and rice wine. So, the practice of praying and honoring the dead is widely accepted.

LITURGICAL COLORS: During the Church Year a verity of colors are used for Holy Mass. But where did they come from and what do they mean? The colors began in the 4th century when the emperor gave colored robes to the bishop of Jerusalem. The colors are used to generate feelings and emotions during Holy Mass. The colors are White, Red, Green, Purple, and Black. In the past 20 years more colors were added, Blue and Rose. They very by season of the year. White is a sing of joy, it is used for Christmas, Easter, and for saints who are not Martyrs. Red, a sign to the Holy Spirit at Pentecost, it is the symbol of fire. Red is used for saints who die for their faith. Green, covers the season outside Easter, during Ordinary time which we are in now. Purple is for sorrow and repentance during Lent. Black is the sign of

mourning for funerals and Good Friday. Blue is used for Advent, we use it during that time because Advent is not like Lent. We do not do the same things in Advent that we do in Lent. It is also a symbol of Our Blessed Mother who we highlight during that time. Rose is used on the 3rd Sunday of Advent and the 4th Sunday of Lent. It is a sign we can take a brief break from our Lenten observance.

VETERAN'S DAY: Will be observed next Saturday November 11th. The day honors all those who fought in wars from the Revolution to modern day wars. Many made the ultimate sacrifice giving their lives. Others have come back from war not in the same shape as when they left. Thank a veteran for their service and pray for those who died in war.
