THE BODY OF CHRIST: Is always celebrated on a Thursday, Why? The Solemnity of Corpus Christi began in the middle ages.in the year 1246. The day is commemorated with Holy Mass and processions. The Blessed Sacrament is carried to the four corners of the world to proclaim that it is the Body of Christ which is given for the nourishment of our souls. It is the food which keeps our souls alive and able to fight off sin. Each time we come to Holy Mass we remember what Jesus did as the Last Supper. The Holy Mass is a perpetual institution to be celebrated until the Jesus returns. The Eucharist is the Body and Blood of Christ given for our salvation. We ought to be sure to receive Holy Communion each time we come to Mass. The Eucharist is kept in the Tabernacle to be honored and worshiped, that is why we knee each time we enter the Church. God loved the world so much that He gave His only Son that we may have life. Jesus gave us His body and blood to nourish and strengthen us.
