MOUNT CARMEL: What happened on Mt. Carmel? **The fire miracle** on Mount Carmel in 1 Kings 18 is one of the most spectacular in the Bible. Elijah called fire down from heaven which consumed not only a bull on an altar but also the altar itself made of twelve stones and twelve pots of water poured on the offering.

MERCY: We are all familiar with the film the Ten commandments. There is the scene when Moses comes down and sees the golden calf. He throws the tablets and destroys the calf and many of the people died. Today's first reading tells us that God wanted to do it and make a new nation for Moses. But, Moses intercedes for the people. Things seem to get smoothed over.

Because of it the people of Israel wondered in the desert for 40 years. Moses tells God not to kill them, because people would say God only brought them out of Egypt to kill them. Moses asked for mercy and God granted it. We sin many times a day, but God the Father shows us mercy rather than let us die in sin. Mercy is not given unless asked for.

When we come to confess our sins we ask for mercy. Mercy is not given unless asked for by us. God does not care if we do not ask. We need to ask for mercy each day. Mercy is granted if we ask. Each time we come to confess or sins to the father we ask mercy for what we have done. In the asking for mercy God knows we will sin again because of things around us or our weakness.

It is in the light of mercy we allowed to continue in faith. That does not mean we can do what we want knowing God will grant us mercy. It is a sin to just rely on God's mercy. We need to do what is necessary to void the temptation to sin. We have to meet the Father half way, to do our best to void the things that lead us to sin, even anger.

Many think they do not need the mercy of the Father, they say I can repent when I am going to die. We do not know when that will be. That is sinful to take God's love and mercy for granted. When we cannot get to Confession we need to end each day with the words, "Father forgive me."
